Pastor Al's Message

"Finally beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about those things."

Philippians 4:8

What we focus on in life... is what we see.

At a recent Confirmation Stretch, we were looking at the third article of the Apostles' Creed that talks about the work of the Holy Spirit. In Luther's explanation of that article, he says, "I believe that by my own understanding or effort, I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him," and then Luther goes on to talk about the four things that the Spirit does (calls, gathers, enlightens and sanctifies us) so that faith might be created and we might believe in Jesus, follow and truly live.

I couldn't help but be reminded of how Paul speaks to the Ephesians about having the "eyes of our hearts enlightened." Luther proclaims and I agree that without the work of the Spirit in my heart and mind, I cannot see Jesus. I cannot believe in Jesus. I cannot come to Jesus and be a part of what he is doing in this world that will give my life any real meaning or worth.

We cannot truly see without the Spirit enlightening us; stretching our hearts and minds so that we can see the things that we typically would walk right by and miss, as we run after things that we believe are important but really are empty and worthless.

What we focus on in life... is what we see. There is a video that a friend sent me years ago that drives this point home for me. In the video it shows three students in white shirts and three in black shirts. They all are passing balls back and forth to one another. The instruction that is given is to just focus on the students in white shirts and to count the number of times they passed the balls.

What happens next though is that, at one point in the middle of the video, a person in a gorilla suits walks right in the center of where the students are passing the balls and moves on through their circle.

When the video was done, all who have watch the video are asked how many times they saw the students in the white shirts pass the ball. Usually you will get a variety of answers... 15, 16, 17. Then, the viewers of the video are asked to raise their hand if they saw anything unusual in the video. Typically only half or less of those watching this video will have seen the person in the gorilla suit.

Most of the people are so focused on counting the passes, they didn't even see the gorilla. I've used this illustration a number of times, and it happens the same every time. The vast majority of people do not see the gorilla.

I believe this is what the third article of the Apostles' Creed is all about.

God's gifts like those that are promised at every baptism.

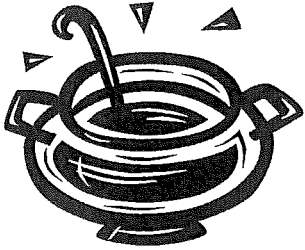
