## "I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to

 which you have been called." (Ephesians 4:1)Many of us have been through fall stewardship processes and education for many years, but what is it really all about?

This year, we will celebrate our Consecration Sunday on October $20^{\text {th }}$. We will have one worship service that morning, at which, Karen Melang will be our preacher. Besides being a member of Sinai, Karen is also a Deacon in the ELCA. I have enjoyed working with her, listening to her present in public, and have enjoyed reflections and devotions that she has written in the past. I look forward to the insights she will share on our Consecration Sunday.

Karen will also lead us, so that at the end of that service, we will have the opportunity to bring forward our "intent to give" cards for 2020 as an act of worship. Following worship, we will head over to Midland's dining hall for our Celebration Lunch.

Our Consecration Sunday Worship and Celebration Lunch have truly been a very meaningful culmination of our stewardship education for years now. At times though, I believe we can get caught up in patterns, and we might miss out on opportunities to be inspired, grow, and be made new again. So what might we intentionally do in the next few weeks?

Last Sunday, we had a bulletin insert, "Consecration Sunday Is Coming." At the heart of what is written, is this statement, "The Consecration Sunday process is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for her or his own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive."

I suggested that in the next few weeks we each might reflect on this insert and on a couple of questions: 1) What is our own personal identity? What are our gifts, talents and passions? 2) What are the ways that we are a part of something so much bigger than ourselves because of this community faith; caring for people within in our walls, but also, beyond our walls and around the world?

Knowing who we are as an individual, and then, reflecting on who we are as a congregation, as a community faith, and as a part of the larger church's ministry and mission, can help to see how we can use who we are in a powerful way. Seeing our own particular gifts, talents and passions within the larger picture can move us to act differently. I do believe this is a powerful truth when it moves from our head to our heart.

I believe it is one thing to be able to say that we agree that our generosity is a healthy part of our spiritual development, but it is another thing, to take the time to slow down, look back at your life, and prayerfully consider how you have been given unique gifts and to see how using them for ministry and mission allow us to taste God's presence. I believe this can truly set us free to be generous.

## Consecration Sunday Is Coming Please join us!

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.
Our congregation's stewardship committee has selected the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.
We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.
We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and church council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.
So we may all join together for this special worship service and celebration on Sunday, October 2 we will have one worship service at 10:00 a.m. with a catered meal following. Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.
